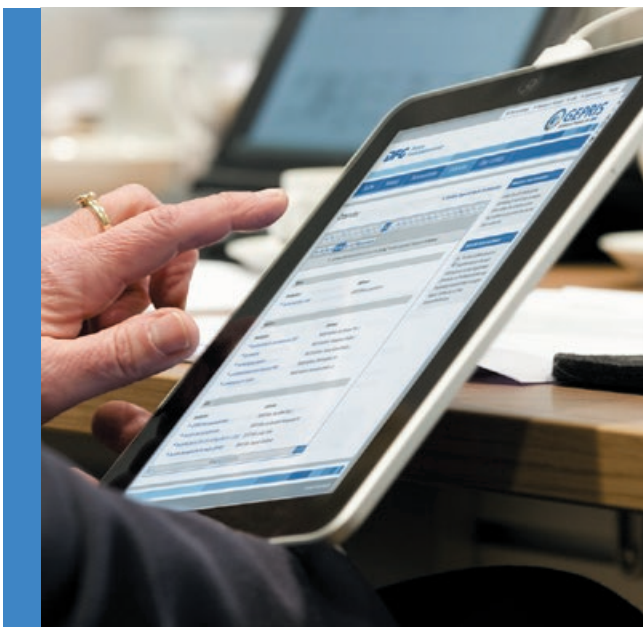

## GEPRIS – Information about DFG-funded projects...

For over fifteen years, the DFG has been publishing information about the projects it funds through GEPRIS, the German Project Information System. Whether a research team received funding for a single project, a Collaborative Research Centre was set up or a research institution received funding for equipment, you will find this information in GEPRIS.

As of April 2018, more than 30,000 institutions, 69,000 researchers and 113,000 projects were listed in GEPRIS. The database is continually updated, so please check back frequently at [www.dfg.de/en/gepris](http://www.dfg.de/en/gepris).

## ... with easy-to-use interface



GEPRIS offers various search options and an effective search function in both German and English.

Information boxes, FAQs and a detailed help page with screenshots are provided to facilitate your search. The clear and user-friendly navigation, now available in English, allows for quick and efficient searches and not only simplifies access for international users but also gives German researchers the possibility to make their research better known internationally.

## ... just a click away

With its various search options, GEPRIS provides one-click access to project information.

Search options include:

- ▶ **Advanced search:** search for people, locations and subject areas as well as by funding programme, continent and country
- ▶ **People index and location index:** search for specific people or an institution in a particular location
- ▶ **Catalogue search:** even more detailed search, for example by subject area, federal state or equipment class
