## Impressions from first day Message well received – cooperation, not competition

Networking was defined as main objective of the NFDI Conference

### Networking was taken up very efficiently

- during the parallel sessions
- using the consortia initiative's posters
- during coffee breaks, lunch and dinner

## Networking seems to lead to fruitful discussions on how potential consortia need to be tailored

- Message understood that there are both needs and opportunities to rethink the original intended consortia cuttings
- Message understood that there is no harm in working on an initiative's maturity before handing in an proposal in the 2nd or 3rd call

# Impressions from first day Message well received – further guidance requested

- Many consortia representatives asked for more and clearer orientation regarding crucial points which are likely to make an application successful
- Address your request by means of three communication lines (if only after the conference ...)
  - The NFDI Expert Committee will provide a general feedback to all conference participants pointing out issues that are either beneficial or unfavourable for an application
  - The NFDI Expert Committee will adopt the documents for consortia applications
    - Guidelines for Consortia
    - Instructions and Template for Consortia Proposals
    - Funding Criteria for NFDI Consortia
  - The DFG's head office will provide advice regarding the application documents and is happy to answer related questions



# Impressions from first day The major challenge - tailoring consortia in the right way

#### Granularity is different from maturity

Both need to be taken into account when tailoring a consortium initiative

- A large-size consortium is not necessarily the best solution although there can be constellations that ask for a large consortium …
- A small-size consortium does not necessarily mean that the consortium is not yet ready ("mature enough") to hand in a proposal – although there are constellations where a small initiative needs to think again …

Reflect further on how you can have the necessary exchange to tailor a suitable consortium initiative – and continue networking

## **Impressions from first day** Be inclusive – deal seriously with communities and users

#### Consortia are groups of users and providers

- It is hard to imagine that a consortium defines and provides its services without having even talked to it's user community – and yet we heard about such initiatives
- Be honest with yourself did you only *"assume"* user needs?

## Communities as such may be more diverse than mighty drivers wish to realise

- "Supertankers" should mind smaller user groups that clearly belong to their iniatives' remit and discuss with them how such groups and their needs will be taken into account.
- Reflect on the tangible benefits of inclusiveness.
- "Supertankers" should carefully reflect whether they make real use of the NFDI's potential.

## **Impressions from first day** Be clear on your objectives – and watch out for alarming signals

Build on already existing structures, yet ...

- In developing them further, make clear and explicit why/that you need new or further elaborated structures
  - It may not be good enough to simply carry on with what you already do and just give a new name to that ...

#### There are clear areas that indicate an initiatives' immaturity, e.g.:

- Plans do simply not relate to potential users.
- Needs that a consortium initiative shall respond to have not been identified.
- Preliminary work is non existent.
