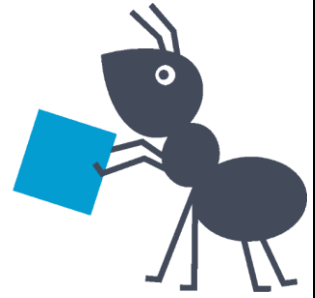

2 Summary

KonsortSWD supports Research Data Management (RDM) in a range of related disciplines. The social, behavioural, educational and economic sciences study how our societies work and contributes to our understanding of them. The data that enable this research are precious because they come from many different sources and often reflect the state of individual people (e.g. health, wealth), how they think, feel, behave. Their confidential nature characterizes much of the data KonsortSWD deals with as sensitive. Against this backdrop, we build on the established system of Research Data Centers (RDCs), accredited by the German Data Forum (Rat für Sozial- und Wirtschaftsdaten, RatSWD) and organised in the “Standing Committee for Research Data Infrastructure” (Ständiger Ausschuss Forschungsdateninfrastruktur, FDI Committee). RDCs offer access to and help with a large variety of sensitive data, ranging from statistical data to recorded videos of interviews.

Being part of NFDI has enabled KonsortSWD to Strengthen, Widen and Deepen the network of RDCs and the services, tools and data they offer to researchers. At this point, there are the following main results and corresponding benefits:

RDC's **accreditation** by RatSWD continues to assure standards for findability and transparent access to high quality data. It is thus a major benefit to our communities as well as for other disciplines where their data are used. Accreditation is effective in enforcing standards, as evidenced by both the refusal of permanent accreditation and the withdrawal of RDC-status in several cases. The Federal Government's Data Strategy underscores the benefit of the **RDC**

model of Data Trustees:^{1 2} it aims to establish further RDCs for official data from various data domains.^{3 4} The RDC model, as operated by KonsortSWD, thereby opens up hitherto unused data treasures to research.

Moreover, KonsortSWD enables RDCs to make **professional RDM services** available to more researchers. This shows, exemplarily, in QualidataNet which is set to launch QualidataNet in early 2024 and provide – amongst other services – a search portal for qualitative data collections and a coordinated core set of metadata to establish FAIRness. On a broader scale researchers already benefit from the Standardised Data Management Plan (Stamp) which structures writing of Data Management Plans (DMPs) and provides guidance in a field where few researchers have expertise.⁵ Stamp is provided by VerbundFDB (German Network of Educational Research Data), was originally funded outside, but in close cooperation with KonsortSWD, and is now part of our portfolio. Benefits from connecting processes and unifying infrastructure also manifest in Forum4MICA. Since its launch this year, Forum4MICA already counts 332 registered users **sharing their knowledge** and helping to make data more easily accessible, analysable and reusable. The public forum enables the search for and exchange of expertise among data users and substantially reduces the time (vis-à-vis email before) for researchers to access the RDC's expert knowledge. Research with sensitive data is becoming much easier thanks to RDCnet, due to be launched in 2024. Data that can currently only be accessed at one RDC (due to privacy / legal regulations) will be **accessible** at several locations, **much closer** to researchers. While **ethical considerations** are often not regarded central to RDM, our website with a collection of [best practices in research ethics](#) has clearly filled a vacuum. Its benefit to researchers and data managers is evident in over **2,800** unique visits since June 2022.⁶

KonsortSWD also has developed services aimed primarily at RDC which generate indirect benefits for the communities we serve. Highly **qualified data curators** are at the core of an effective RDM. The certificate course developed as part of KonsortSWD's compilation of RDM training materials – [RDM Compas](#)⁷ – is laying groundwork that has been proposed to be part of

an NFDI Basic Service, submitted by section EduTrain and currently under evaluation, helping to secure the quality of RDM services at RDCs but also beyond at other research institutions. A further benefit for RDCs are **PIDs** below the level of datasets, currently being tested by several partners in KonsortSWD. They will make concepts and single items findable, citable and therefore more re-usable enabling better research. Eventually, PIDs at the level of concepts and variables will make this level of data machine actionable and support linking of large numbers of datasets. Summing up: The main benefits of KonsortSWD aimed directly at researchers are a) quality-controlled data provision through accreditation of RDCs, b) spread of RDM services, creating communities and sharing knowledge around datasets, c) bringing sensitive data closer to users and d) sharing ethical best practices. Furthermore, KonsortSWD supports RDCs and thereby generates indirect benefits for researchers by e) enhancing the qualifications of data curators and f) increasing the accessibility of data by PIDs on level of variables and concepts.

KonsortSWD develops services by involving researchers from the community and draws on the expertise of its advisory board. The board's members come from RatSWD which continues to make substantial and timely contributions to the ongoing political debates on data. This is part of improving the value of our infrastructure and making more relevant data accessible to research. To this end, RatSWD provides widely valued expertise and promotes the necessary changes in Germany's and Europe's **legal framework** to law and decision makers.

We consider RatSWD's and the FDI Committee's continued contribution to the data landscape a success made possible through KonsortSWD. KonsortSWD enhances the cooperation of long-time partners within NFDI. KonsortSWD increased the sustainability of RDCs by providing impulses for closer cooperation and additional standardised processes supported by tools and services. We are excited to further deepen our network with new partners and new activities, starting in the fall of 2023. Taking up the positive experiences of other consortia, KonsortSWD will begin to introduce a **helpdesk** as a first contact point for data users by October 1st, 2023.

Challenges still to be addressed are plentiful despite successes: with more data types being used in our disciplines, KonsortSWD must be alert to the most user-friendly ways of providing access and assuring reusability, also for new groups of users.⁸ NFDI's basic services will complement our efforts (e.g., through authentication of researchers) even though their roll-out in a landscape of independent institutions will be a substantial challenge in itself. We also look forward to developing use cases for cross-consortial data and the processes that can be developed to streamline and improve such uses. KonsortSWD will contribute to the joint architecture of NFDI services. Furthermore, KonsortSWD is monitoring similar developments across Europe and has started a dialogue with social science infrastructure initiatives in several countries. ■
