2 Summary

Text+ follows the mission for the text- and language-oriented humanities and social sciences to extensively leverage the possibilities of digitisation in their research, teaching, and transfer, establishing a common data culture. Text+ empowers text and language data and access to such data. Access to digital sources should become a standard. Text+ enhances the digital literacy of researchers and encompasses the diversity of the research community and builds on their participation. To achieve this, we promote inter- and transdisciplinarity as well as innovation – for instance in the field of artificial intelligence – through the integration of infrastructure and research.

The consortium started with 30 partners, all making significant in-kind contributions. All the original partners remain, and three new partners have joined, expanding Text+ in terms of expertise, resources and community collaboration. Collaborative projects have been an effective means of disseminating Text+ services, resulting in a large number of applications and funded projects that continue to expand Text+.

Communities of interest play an active role in the governance of Text+ through community-based panels. The consortium benefits the communities by providing data, services and knowledge sharing, integrating diverse research efforts and developing new methodologies. Collaboration with other consortia and joint contributions to relevant conferences enhance these benefits.

Text+ is actively involved in the development and establishment of the National Research Data Infrastructure (NFDI) in Germany. We participate in various NFDI events, meetings and task forces to contribute to the mission and vision of the NFDI and cooperate with other consortia.

Text+ maintains close links with European Research Infrastructure Consortia (ERICs) such as CLARIN and DARIAH. We also collaborate with the European Open Science Cloud (EOSC) and other European cloud services. Text+ is involved in the exchange of RDM practices and standards through various international networks and organisations.

Text+ addresses three Grand Challenges: mastering the diversity of research data, supporting humanities scholars, and developing a governance model that supports shared responsibility and consensus building. The Text+ Data Space integrates data from different sources, improving the discoverability, searchability and reusability of humanities research data.

Success Stories

- Integration of new partners and data sets, such as the Deutscher Sprachatlas.
- Development of the Text+ Registry, Federated Content Search (FCS) and Text+ Consulting for improved data findability, access and interoperability.
- Successful cooperation projects that broaden the diversity of data types handled by the infrastructure.

Challenges to be Addressed

- Technological Advancements: Integrating large language models (LLMs) and addressing legal constraints related to data licensing and copyright laws.
- Structural Changes: Adapting to developments within the NFDI, such as the ones provided through Base4NFDI, developing basic services for the NFDI.
- Diversity and Inclusion: Ensuring gender balance and diversity across disciplines, career levels, and academic interests.

Text+ has made significant progress in expanding its consortium, integrating different data types and contributing to the development of the NFDI. The consortium's efforts in international networking, governance and community involvement have been instrumental in its success.
