

Silent posting of failures and learnings on a wall – exercise of letting go (taring failures apart)

Privileges


Group discussion on "How different are the stakes for failing and who do we allow to fail?"

Narratives

Group discussion on "Narratives and perspectives when telling the story of our projects"

Communicating

Collecting and learning about tools such as the "CV of failures" or "Failure Talks/Fuck-Up-Nights"



Team culture

Group discussion on "How to establish failure-friendliness in my team? How to reward learning behaviour instead of just results?"

Honesty Postcards


Designing postcards to collaborators and being honest about the success/failures of past projects

Systemic View

Silent writing dialogue on "What has to change in the research community to become failure-friendly?"

Sharing stories

Individual conversations about own experiences of perceived failures




... for group meetings

- Communicate that it is normal to make mistakes and share own stories
- Make successes as well as failures a regular part of weakly group meetings
- "Fuck-Up-Friday" in the team sharing really stupid mistakes and learnings and laugh

... for leadership in general

- Celebrating "small" success stories (together)
- Be constructive highlight the improvement and learnings
- When reacting to mistakes/failures don't judge or blame, be de-escalating
- Get to know your team members, what their stakes are foster trust
