
The DFG selects and funds **high-quality research** and enables fair, science-led competition







Position in a DFG-funded project





What?

Position (TV-L) for (post-)doctoral researchers at universities/research institutes in Germany



How long?

Depends on the scope of the project, typically three years



Where to apply?

Directly to the project's PI (person who receives funding through DFG)



Research project in Germany

Funding for up to three years

Host institution of your choice in Germany



Flexible funding: staff, consumables, travel...

Temporary Position for Principal Investigators = "Eigene Stelle"

Employment through host institution (TV-L scheme)









Abroad or in Germany


or combining stays at different places

In Germany: Position at host institution


+ allowance for direct project costs (250€/month)

Abroad: Fellowship (2.187€/month)


- + allowance for direct project costs (312€/month)
- + further allowances for cost of living, purchase power equalization, children (if applicable)
- → Use the <u>award calculator</u>

Funding Aims

Path to early academic independence

Qualification for a university teaching career

Eligibility for professorial appointment by leading one's own independent junior research group






Heisenberg-Programme

...while continuing their research.





Funding for up to five years

Funding options: fellowship | position | professorship

Additional flexible funding €1,000 or €250 per month

Can be **combined** with a **research grant** proposal









Numbers of Proposals and Success Rates* in Programmes for Early Career Researchers (mean values; 2021 to 2024)

From Submission to Decision



What is the **knowledge gap** you would like to fill?

Why are the expected results novel and relevant?

Who is going to do what? Why?

What's your **concrete**, **realistic** and **feasible** plan to answer your research question?

How are you going to manage setbacks? What's your **plan b?**

Why are you the right person to successfully manage this project?


Why is the **host institution** ideal for your project?

Carefully read and follow the guidelines and proposal instructions

Decide on the proposal language: English or German

Preparing your CV



Follow the DFG CV Template



Include prizes, fellowships & awards



Mention time away from research

Relating e.g. to family, illness or dependent care; no details required



List up to ten peer reviewed publications

Comment on your contribution if not obvious




No upper limits

Needs to be realistic and justified by the project

DFG funds only supplemental, project-specific needs (vs. existing resources at your institution)

Seek advice from other grant applicants, recipients, institutions

List of average personnel rates on DFG website



Before Submission

Put yourself in the reviewers shoes:

Consult the <u>"General Guidelines for the Written Review"</u> for reviewers



Seek honest criticism from colleagues

Plan on a feasible timeline: on average, the time to decision is approx. six months





Inform DFG Head Office in case a conflict of interest or competitive scenario exists

Care obligations and DFG funding

There are various possibilities for family-related part-time work, periods of absence due to parental leave or caring for children or other relatives. The same applies for long-term illness or disability.






Review Boards

Elections every four years by the community of ~ 150,000 researchers in Germany






Joint Committee

- Final decision on all DFG grants

In case your proposal is not successful...





Don't be discouraged

Unfortunately, the majority of proposals cannot be funded.

Take the reviewers's comments seriously, but not personally

Consider the reviewers comments

They might give you some pointers for reworking and resubmitting your proposal

Consult the DFG Head Office

If you need advice or feel treated unfairly

Common reasons for proposal rejection



- Doubts about the scientific contribution
- Main aspects of research question already answered
- Open questions regarding the work plan / not enough detail
- Concerns regarding the feasibility of the planned project
- Doubts about the suitability of the research methods to achieve the project goals
- Doubts about the applicant's expertise
