

Granting of Usage Rights to Proposal Content

In order to be able to process research funding proposals in a legally secure manner, the DFG requires a limited right to use the documents you submit. When submitting a proposal, you are therefore asked to grant the DFG the rights required for this purpose. Important: We only require the rights that are strictly necessary for the DFG's purposes. You remain free to use your content as you wish.

The DFG protects applicants' legitimate interests and sets clear requirements to ensure that proposal documents are treated confidentially. In particular, the DFG has issued a [guideline](#) governing the use of AI systems in the review process which all reviewers and members of DFG statutory bodies are required to follow.

Each time you submit a proposal to the DFG, you as the author of the proposal documents grant the DFG a non-exclusive, non-transferable, sublicensable, free-of-charge right to use the texts and all other copyright-protected content you provide, without territorial or time limitations, for the purpose of processing the proposal; this right is irrevocable within the limits of the law.

If you are not the sole author, you confirm that you hold the necessary rights or else have the authority to act on behalf of all persons and institutions involved in granting these rights to the DFG (e.g. by obtaining the consent of all co-authors). This applies in particular if you submit a proposal on behalf of one or more universities, for example as the designated spokesperson of a Collaborative Research Centre or Transregio.

The right of use you grant to the DFG is limited in scope to acts associated with the administration, review and evaluation of the proposal and the funding decision. This includes necessary reproductions and disclosures to third parties (reviewers, members of DFG statutory bodies), guideline-compliant processing in AI systems by the DFG Head Office, reviewers and members of DFG statutory bodies, and, in the event of a positive funding decision, publication of the proposal abstract and final report abstract in accordance with the DFG's funding guidelines.

You are only required to submit this declaration once. A renewed declaration may be required if legally relevant changes become necessary.
